General ESFRA Policies and Procedures

Attendance

- ✓ <u>Arrival</u> Please arrive on time for your program. Why is that? Our programs are designed to provide your child with the full benefit of a structured program and interruptions can cause focus to be lost for others.
- ✓ <u>Absence</u> Please call the Family Centre if not attending class on any given day with the reason (e.g., transportation, illness, work, medical apt., or weather) at 902-827-1461 (NOT FACEBOOK). This allows the staff to properly prepare for the day while avoiding waste of program materials.
- ✓ <u>Cancellation</u> After two missed sessions (2 weeks) without notification, staff will contact you if your child is returning. If there is no contact, unfortunately your space will be opened to others on our waitlist. If you do not plan to continue to attend, please advise staff.
- ✓ Closures (Holiday or Weather) Our regular programs do not operate on school holidays such as March Break or winter days when schools are closed, or buses are not running. Participants are asked if in doubt, to call the Family Centre or check our Facebook page, before attempting to attend. At times ESFRA programs and other services will be cancelled at the Executive Director's discretion due to inclement weather or other.

- ✓ <u>Footwear</u> For safety reasons, all participants (adults & children) are required to wear appropriate indoor footwear during programs. Fire Safety Drills will happen randomly plus during rainy/snowy weather, clean footwear keeps our floors dry and safe.
- ✓ <u>Illness</u> If you or your child is sick you are to refrain from attending ESFRA programs and services. In case of common communicable childhood diseases such as chicken pox, 5th disease, head lice etc., participants are asked to notify ESFRA of the condition by calling 902-827-1461.
- ✓ <u>Participation</u> For the program to benefit everyone, parents/caregivers and children, must arrive on time and participate with intention.



Attendance Etiquette

- ✓ <u>Cell Phone</u> ESFRA respectfully requests that all participants keep cell phones on 'vibrate' during programs to avoid interrupting class 'flow.' Please restrict use to calls/texting for emergency use ONLY.
- ✓ <u>Conversation</u> Little ears are listening...... We encourage relationships and conversations between parents in our programs. We ask that during your time in any ESFRA program, all participants are mindful of the topics of conversation and vocabulary being age appropriate and respectful.
- ✓ <u>Departure</u> Families are respectfully requested to leave immediately following their program session. If you need to speak with an ESFRA staff, we kindly ask you contact them from home via telephone (902-827-1461).
- ✓ <u>Drink/Food</u> For safety reasons, no hot drinks or food are allowed in the program room at any location.
- ✓ <u>Early Arrival</u> We request that parents and children arrive no earlier than 5 minutes prior to program time. This allows staff to plan and prepare for the day so ALL can have fun and play.
- ✓ Hand Sanitizer Kiosks are located in the hallway and in the centre space.
- ✓ Parental/Caregiver Supervision All parents & caregivers attending SPECIFIED INTERACTIVE PROGRAMS with their child(ren) MUST always REMAIN ON SITE. ESFRA is not a Licenced Daycare; therefore, we have restrictions both in Funding and Insurance. Our Program Facilitators are there to guide parents/caregivers and children through the length of the program. Parents/caregivers are responsible for all children in their care when in Interactive Programs.
- ✓ Toys Please do not bring toys from home unless requested as part of the program.

✓ Use of Facility

- <u>Babes in Arms</u> Due to capacity limits and safety Babes in Arms (under 12 months) are not permitted in programs where age for participation is clearly stated. Wee Bears is the only exception currently. Please contact ESFRA's Program Director before registering for clarity purposes.
- <u>Breastfeeding</u> Priding ourselves on being a Breastfeeding Friendly space, ESFRA allows a mother in need of a safe space to use our Centre when we are open, regardless of a current program enrollment.
- Minors Due to capacity limits, school-age children CANNOT be waiting on-site while siblings are attending our programs.
- <u>Privacy</u> Due to activities within our Centre, please respect the times noted for your program's start and end times. Occasionally there may be times ESFRA is not open to the public due to a meeting/program requiring discretion or privacy.

Current Programs Fall 2023

Afternoon Artiste - Semester Program



Afternoon Artiste is a 6-week interactive parent/caregiver and child(ren) program with weekly themes designed to help school aged children 5 to 10 years learn new creative techniques. Ticket is required for attendance.

Bookworms at Play - Semester Program



Bookworms at Play Program will be offered in two (2) sessions to accommunity an ramilies in our community. This literacy-based program for 3yrs – 5yrs places greater emphasis on family literacy through parent-child interactive components. Having fun activities during the program but also ones to be completed at home – all being added together to create their own book. Our maximum group size is 8 children participating.

Families will only be permitted to register for 1 semester per program year. Priority will be given to families not already having registered for this program. However, space permitting, there might be opportunity for an additional semester. Not allowing babes in arms due to participation requirements.

Coffee Connection – Drop-In Program



This drop-in program allows parents/caregivers a space to connect with each other over a cup of tea, coffee, hot chocolate, or water while their young ones (between 1yr-5yrs) make social/peer connections in the adjoining childcare room. This program will happen on specified dates advertised a week in advance.

Explore the Shore – Drop-In Program

Happening monthly, Explore the Shore is for getting out as "adventurers" and "tourists" to experience all that our Eastern Shore has to offer. Enrollment is for parents/caregivers and child(ren) from 3 years old & up. Participation in each themed event adds a new stamp to your Shore Explorer passport. Experiences will have a maximum capacity depending on location with Tickets being required in advance for each event.

Full STEAM Ahead - Drop-In Program

This drop-in program for children/youth (ages 5-12 years) along with parents/caregivers, explores STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Math) activities. Session components include a pre-activity discussion (area of focus, project & learning objectives & project implementation), project exploration, reflection with real world application plus Take-Home Supplies for further at home investigation.

Home School Hobnob - 5 Session Program



NEW this 2023-24 year for School Aged children (between 4 to 12 years) and their parent/caregiver!

With specific dates, ESFRA has space for up to 16 children being home schooled can enjoy our location as a place to hobnob (socialize) and share tips & tricks with other families. On occasions ESFRA will present a themed activity for participants to enjoy based on STEAM

concepts. This program will also require TICKETS to gauge attendance and have any supplies needed for the session.

Jolly Phonics – Semester Program

Using the Jolly Phonics curriculum, this interactive program for parents/caregivers and their children between the ages of 3-5 years old focuses on teaching children the basic skills needed for reading in a fun, engaging way. Including weekly take home activities plus each child receives a phonemic assessment conducted periodically during the program. When offered, we are limited to 8 children. Not allowing babes in arms due to participation requirements.

Kids 'N Elders – Semester Program

Kids 'N Elders is an inter-generational fun & social weekly playgroup.

Parents Parents/caregivers and children, ages 1-5 years, join senior residents, from the local Birches Home for Special Care, at their site. Designed to exchange among all in attendance: 'old and new' songs, stories, laughter, and creative talent. Ticket/Registration is required for this program, one per child (adult included).

New Parent Group - Program Year

The New Parent Group will be offered from September to June, or until your baby ages out at 18 months, to accommodate all families in our community. Based on participation, this group is being offered in two locations and on two different days this year. Both locations can host

special guest visits, such as the Public Health Nurse. Due to space capacity, our maximum group size is limited to 12 parents & babies.

Play Dates Are Us! - Drop-In Program

The Play Dates Are Us! Drop-In Program is designed for parents/caregivers and confiden to play, chat & connect. Due to space capacity, our maximum group size is limited to 10 children between 0 to 5yrs and their parents/caregivers participating.

Priority will be given to families not already having registered for this program. However, space permitting, there might be opportunity for an additional semester.
